Youth Minister
serving three local parishes
Marblehead, Massachusetts

Overview

Three churches in Marblehead have joined together to support a shared part-time youth position (19 hours per week) to cultivate our Christian youth programming in Marblehead, MA. These churches are: Clifton Lutheran Church, Old North Church (United Church of Christ), and St Andrew's Episcopal Church.

The parishes are located in Marblehead, MA, a coastal New England town in Essex County situated 16 miles north of Boston. Their parishioners come from Marblehead, Salem, Swampscott, Lynn and a few other local communities. Marblehead and Swampscott are more suburban communities while Salem and Lynn are considered more urban. Each parish has a full-time clergy position, in addition to other staff. Each parish has its own community, parish culture, programs, and events. The churches share a firm grounding in Christianity and a wish to lead their congregants to live loving, Christian lives.

The churches affirm and celebrate the diversity of their communities in all backgrounds, ages, abilities, races, colors, cultures, origins, genders, gender identities and/or expressions, orientations and social statuses

Overview of the Churches

Clifton Lutheran Church

Clifton is an ELCA Lutheran church that is Reconciling in Christ (RIC) LGBTQIA+ affirming. Music and worship play a central and transformative role in Clifton's ministry, with its talented choir, regular guest musicians, and children's choir. It has a holistic, multigenerational approach to its liturgical worship cycle. The congregation is passionate about community service and engagement including the interfaith food security nonprofit it founded called the Manna Project and its decades long partnership with Mission of Hope in Haiti. Because of its location, Clifton is a gateway church with members coming from Swampscott, Salem, Beverly and Lynn. Clifton is known as the "pumpkin church" selling thousands of pumpkins each fall and supporting indigenous farmers in New Mexico.

Old North Church

Old North Church is a progressive, traditional congregation of the United Church of Christ. Founded in 1635, we are the oldest congregation in Marblehead. We became Open and Affirming in 2008, and have employed multiple LGBTQ ministers. We have a large music program featuring organ and piano music, a handbell choir, and a 25-member choir. ONC has a strong tradition of supporting people in need locally, providing disaster relief, and maintaining a supportive relationship with our sister church in South Africa. Pre-COVID, we had a large and vibrant youth program that drew youth from across the town; this youth group engaged in service projects locally and mission trips in the wider USA and abroad. We have over 400 members with over 200 pledgers. Staff positions: full-time senior interim minister, half-time associate minister, half-time music minister, half-time director of children’s ministries, half-time church administrator.

St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church

St. Andrew’s Church is known for its warm community, as well as its social justice outreach. Recent projects include Welcome the Stranger, support of Massachusetts minimum wage campaign, friendship with St. Stephen’s Episcopal Church of Lynn/Beloved Community, implementation of a large food ministry during Covid, participation in PRIDE parade for many years, and sponsorship of SPUR community garden. St. Andrew’s completed a highly successful capital campaign in advance of its centennial in 2024, with numerous celebrations planned. The church has approximately 300 members (mostly older) with 105 pledgers, weekly attendance of 55 (105 pre-Covid), Godly Play for ages 3-7, and monthly gatherings for elementary-age children and families.

The Position of Youth Minister

The Youth Minister position will play a crucial and foundational role, focusing on the middle school and high school youth in our shared parishes. It provides the opportunity to build a shared community among the churches and to create an engaging, innovative, progressive Christian youth program that supports a thriving, growing religious culture to serve our community across generations. This person will partner with clergy, staff, and volunteers to

empower youth to grow their faith, to explore life questions, and to participate together in activities, events, and outreach.

The Youth Minister will be a colleague of the clergy of the three churches and will be supported and overseen by the Marblehead Youth Cooperative Ministry (MYCM) Board, made up of appointed lay church members (three from each parish).

Interested candidates should bring a well-grounded Christian faith that can be shared and explored with young people. The candidate should be able to collaborate with a variety of others (clergy, youth, volunteers, community members) to accomplish goals and to build relationships. An ideal candidate is a gifted teacher/mentor of youth who respects young people, encourages questions and thoughtful discussions, fosters strong relationships, promotes inclusion, and builds community. Specific to inclusivity, the candidate will work to ensure a safe and accepting space for youth members of the LGBTQIA+ community. The candidate should have a strong interest in working with youth, seeking to inspire them to explore progressive Christian values, to involve them appropriately in group decisions, and to lead them in a variety of discussions, activities, events, and outreach. We anticipate that the Youth Minister will visit each church each month and will maintain a calendar that fairly and flexibly involves all three church communities, as well as time to oversee a central, combined youth group. Each church will provide a workspace dedicated to this individual.

Duties and Responsibilities

1. Develop and lead the program for youth, in particular a combined youth group (or two groups separated by age, e.g., middle school and high school), including youth in decision-making, as the program develops over time.
2. Lead family and youth outreach including ongoing relationship building, engagement, and communication.
3. Create and maintain a flexible monthly calendar that includes all three churches and youth activities.
4. Participate regularly and flexibly in each parish. Integrate into the unique culture of each parish, while owning the full Youth Ministry program and its execution.
5. Communicate regularly with the MYCM board and clergy and attend regular check-in meetings. Communicate weekly with the assigned board representative(s) in the first 90 days, with room for mutually agreed upon changes.
6. Communicate with youth, families and partners about current happenings, volunteer opportunities, events, etc. and market opportunities to increase engagement.
7. Build partnerships with agencies and community groups as appropriate; attend community-wide events as applicable.
8. Conduct relevant data collection including program participation, engagement, and impact; maintain a database of active participants.
9. Work 19 hours per week, with regular on-site and weekend commitments; no more than two evenings a week.

Required Qualifications

- Enthusiastic about inspiring the Christian faith in young people
- Bachelor's degree or higher
- Experience working with youth in a Christian setting
- Experience and aptitude in working effectively with a wide variety of backgrounds, abilities, races, cultures, genders, gender identities and orientations
- Strong leadership and organizational skills
- Excellent interpersonal and facilitation skills
- Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Computer and data management skills
- Ability to work well with clergy, parish staff, and lay church leaders
- Commitment to reach out to and participate in the larger community

Preferred Skills and Experience

- An ordained minister in good standing, or leadership experience in a church setting
- Experience teaching or leading religious education
- Experience in teaching, lesson planning, and/or creating youth programs

Compensation and Benefits

The Marblehead Youth Ministry Cooperative will offer a total package of \$40,000-\$50,000 based on experience. Total package includes benefits to be negotiated.
